Vocabulary/words (in your texts)

"In context" means how the words relates to other words around them.

Most writers leave context clues for words as they write. So, the reader has to find these clues to understand the words. Here are some clues:

- Giving the same type of word (e.g. verb and verb, noun and noun)
- Giving an appositive (look for a form of verb to be)
- Rewording the word. (look for such words as in other words, that is, ..)
- Giving the clause markers
- Giving its Synonym (look for the punctuation)
- Giving its Antonym.
- Giving us details about the word. (use your knowledge to guess)

You can try to guess the meanings of words in context of your text.


